

Prep 100 Tutor

Summary

Prep 100 tutors work in partnership with learners to provide tutoring in basic math, reading, writing, and digital literacy skills. Tutors and learners meet in a structured, class-like environment designed to foster learning and growth.

Responsibilities

- Follow all current Washtenaw Literacy and Washtenaw Community College guidelines for COVID-19 safety
- Follow Washtenaw Literacy guidelines for effective tutoring
- Dedicate 1.5-2 hours once or twice weekly at a scheduled time, meeting at Washtenaw Community College.
- Perform assessments with learners as needed.
- Tutor one or more learners based on need.
- Develop sessions tailored to meet the specific goals of each learner.
- Be flexible to accommodate learners' specific needs and requests during sessions.
- Complete the required semester update form.

Successful Traits

- Willingness to learn and teach digital skills, if needed.
- Familiarity with job search techniques (helpful but not required).
- Ability to draw connections between tutoring and everyday lives
- Flexibility to adapt to learners' unique needs.
- Understanding and patience for learners who may face challenges in engaging with the material.

- Age: Must be 18 or older
- Supervision: Program Coordinator
